


First, Vanessa helped Richard regain his legal identification documents. After a few months, Richard agreed it was time to find a safer place to live. With Vanessa's help, Richard is now in a safe living situation and is able to look for stable employment.

Hunger Relief

17,305 Visits to the Market

Cross-Lines' Hunger Relief programs play a crucial role in supporting individuals and families facing food insecurity in Wyandotte County.

The utilization of the Community Market saw another significant surge throughout 2023, serving as direct evidence of the growing demand within our community and underscoring the effectiveness of the Market's respectful and dignified approach to its operations.

Cross-Lines is proud of the strides we've made in our innovative market model. Each person who visits The Market is greeted and welcomed to shop at their own pace while choosing just the right food (including meat, dairy, and fresh produce) and products for their family.

62,376 Meals Served

In addition to the Market, Cross-Lines' Community Kitchen provides warm breakfasts, lunches, and sack lunches for takeaway to the community every weekday. **Anyone needing a meal can rely on Cross-Lines for support from Monday to Friday.** Thanks to the generosity of our community and volunteers, we can ensure that thousands of individuals in need receive a hot and nutritious meal.

The Community Kitchen not only provides meals but also a safe and welcoming community gathering space. Often, a person's first experience with Cross-Lines is through the Kitchen. Our Navigators are able to share in that safe space with our guests and create relationships that can lead to connections to an array of services in and outside of Cross-Lines.

Housing Stabilization

\$281,019 in Rent and Utility Assistance

The challenges of homelessness and the lack of affordable housing pose significant obstacles for individuals in Wyandotte County. Cross-Lines' Housing Team is dedicated to creating avenues toward secure housing for those facing homelessness, housing instability, or financial strain.

Our team of case managers prioritizes identifying appropriate resources for our clients, emphasizing whole-person care, addressing immediate relief of presenting needs, health & well-being, and devising strategies for achieving lasting financial stability.

Throughout 2023, our community witnessed a notable escalation in demand for assistance. As many federal COVID-era aid initiatives ended, a record number of individuals sought support from Cross-Lines.

61 People Moved into Stable Housing

Thanks to your generosity, the Cross-Lines Housing team successfully provided aid in covering over 500 rent and utility payments while facilitating the transition of 61 formerly unsheltered households into permanent housing.

Your contributions prevented numerous families from slipping through the cracks, ensuring that a single late rent or utility payment did not result in homelessness for hundreds of households. Your support also played a vital role in aiding families during medical emergencies, sudden job loss, or unexpected vehicle breakdowns.

Collaboration

KCK Cold Weather Shelter

Alongside numerous partner agencies, Cross-Lines took the lead in operating the 2022-2023 KCK Cold Weather Shelter. This collaborative initiative offered vital sanctuary to individuals experiencing homelessness in Wyandotte County during the harshest of weather conditions.

2022-2023 Season Stats:

-Open 28 nights; met capacity of 40 people on 17 nights -Sheltered 234 unique quests -12 guests connected to permanent housing-84 guests connected to supportive services

Street Outreach

On a weekly basis, Cross-Lines, the KCK Police Department, and collaborators from the Wyandot Behavioral Health Network unite to conduct street outreach, endeavoring to contact our homeless neighbors in their current locations. Street outreach personnel listen attentively to individuals experiencing homelessness, provide links to essential services, and convey that there are compassionate individuals who genuinely care about them, irrespective of their circumstances or history. In 2023, our team made 400+ unique contacts and worked to provide assistance to everyone who accepted it.

WYCO Housing Summit

Housing advocates, community development professionals, and other stakeholders gathered to focus on strategies to increase safe and affordable housing options in Wyandotte County, Kansas. Organized by Cross-Lines' Rachel Russell and hosted by the Wyandotte County Safe and Affordable Housing Action Team, the 5th annual Housing Summit highlighted organizations working to address the community's affordable housing needs.
