Susan and Russ' decade of growing for good



For the past ten years, our amazing neighbors, Susan Clevenger and Dr. Russ King, have been managing a community garden in Wyandotte County, donating all of the produce to the Cross-Lines Community Market. Their dedication has yielded thousands of pounds of fresh vegetables and fruits, helping to feed those in need. In 2021, Susan began volunteering regularly at the Community Market, further strengthening her connection to Cross-Lines. The garden began as a project of the Village West Rotary Club, of which Susan was a member. "We saw an empty plot of land owned by Medical Solutions, a company Russ co-owns with three partners, and thought it would be the perfect place for a community garden," Susan recalls.

The garden was built by an Eagle Scout project and designed to resemble the Rotary Club emblem—a six-spoke wheel. Over the years, the garden has produced an array of crops including squash, tomatoes, onions, potatoes, cucumbers, melons, eggplants, and peppers, delivering 3,300 pounds of fresh produce just last year. Now, the Bonner Springs Rotary Club sponsors the garden while Medical Solutions continues to supply the water.

For Susan, the most rewarding part of managing the garden and working with Cross-Lines is the relationships she's built. "I love volunteering at the Community Market," she says. "The people I work with—staff and shoppers alike—make it a joy. I also help Russ with delivering the produce and step in to manage the garden when he's away."

Russ, who shares a passion for gardening, sees it as both a hobby and a way to stay active.

"Gardening is great exercise and comes with health benefits," he says. In addition to his work with the garden, Russ volunteers with the Boy Scouts, helping with physical and medical missions.

Together, Susan and Russ have made a remarkable impact on our community, combining their love for gardening with a deep commitment to serving those in need. We are grateful for their ongoing generosity and dedication to Cross-Lines!
