

Hello, Mike and Sandy!

We interviewed Mike and Sandy during Pride ?? month (June). Mike and Sandy have known each other for over 20 years; they first met while doing work for lesbian women's health. They've become good friends over the years and enjoy volunteering together in the Market!

Q. How long have you been volunteering at Cross-Lines?

Mike: Three years as Community Market volunteer. I first heard about Cross-Lines through my previous boss, former board member Nancy Moilan, so I've been affiliated with Cross-Lines in different aspects/ways for the last 15-20 years but only started regularly volunteering two years

ago. I retired three years ago and I wanted to get more involved.

Sandy: On and off for about 15 years. I started in the Community Garden, then I volunteered in the Christmas Store for many years and then over here in the Community Market.

Q. What do you love most about volunteering at Cross-Lines?

Mike: I especially like the mission of the organization. I like how the staff and volunteers are committed, genuinely, to the mission. I like hands-on work. I did a lot of administrative work and managing people in my professional career, so it's nice to be hands-on and I can see the direct results of putting food out on the shelves and knowing people will take that food to eat. I appreciate the staff support and all the people working for the mission of Cross-Lines.

Sandy: I love the values and mission of Cross-Lines. The staff is very friendly. I like that you're busy from the moment you walk in and until the end of shift and when you leave you feel like you've made a difference.

Q. Where can we usually find you volunteering?

Mike: I volunteer, once a week, at Deanna Rose Children's Farmstead, as a baby goat attendant. I love goats and I've always felt/had an affinity for them so now I get to be a baby goat attendant. It's a great organization with really good people and I love hanging out with goats. I'm also an ambassador for the LGBT Chamber of Commerce. It's a good organization and I like that I'm connected with the activities of the community.

Susan: I volunteer at Kansas City Community Gardens.

Sandy: Don't be afraid, everything will work out.

Q.What's your favorite LGBT+ history moment?

Mike: I'm retired from the miliary. I was in the Marine Corps Reserve for 6 years and the KS Air National Guard for 17 years. I was there during a time when it was don't ask don't tell. When they overturned that and it allowed folks to be open, it was amazing. The second moment would have to be the legalization of gay marriage. I have been with my partner for 30 years and now I've been married to my husband for 8 years.


